The new equipment is now installed in the church and we are learning all about its new potential. Please connect to us in the usual way and watch how our broadcasts develop with a much more sophisticated set up.






Food Bank – All donations welcome. There is a current shortage of: toiletries, small bottles of squash, tinned dog food, long life milk.
