I know I am biased, but I think that the celebrations for Christmas 2024 were amongst the most joyful ever. Cerys devised a lovely Advent evening service that set us off on the journey to Bethlehem.

Three Sundays focussing on with a theme of prayer provided the focus for our spiritual journey. On the way we played host to three church services for local schools, services in the nursing homes, a carol service in the church yard which attracted the biggest crowd we can remember and carol singing on Crown Way which was done in partnership with our friends at the Free Church.

The choir excelled themselves at the service of Nine Lessons and Carols and I was once again lifted heavenwards as they sang the third verse of "O come all ye faithful". A production line gathered to manufacture 350 Christingles on December 23rd and three teams of helpers ensured that all those who attended the Christingle services were kept safe despite the congestion and the candlelight. Attendance at all the services was up with increases of 24% at the Carol Service and Christingle alone. The bell ringers rang to announce the good news of all that was happening, and we are grateful to them for their dedication again. The church was beautifully decorated by the flower arrangers and we were blessed by so many people helping once again to ensure the light that came into the world at Christmas was proclaimed afresh.


