



Dear Friends,

It can feel very busy at times here in the Parish. I am often trying to catch up and keep on top of things, trying to fit 30 hours into just 24. A little while back I was racing from appointment to appointment to try and fit in as much as possible.



I had an appointment in Coventry. With the clock ticking I drove in and parked the car in the closest free space I could find with a view to popping into a bookshop on an errand while I was there. I'd given myself about 34 of an hour to try and get everything done.

Once I'd got what I wanted I hurried back to where I'd parked the car. But when I returned, I found that another vehicle had parked so close that I couldn't move. The other driver was nowhere to be seen! With the car completely blocked in, my busyness was brought to an abrupt halt. There was nothing I could do. I had a list of jobs requiring my attention back at the Vicarage but no means of getting there.

Initially I found the experience deeply frustrating and I must confess to harbouring a few uncharitable thoughts about the car driver who had reduced me to this state of inactivity. But then it occurred to me that since I was going nowhere, I might as well use the time usefully.

Being forced to stop in the midst of all my busyness was actually something that did me a power of good. Sometimes we can simply become too busy to find the time to stop and simply be still. Sometimes when it comes to setting our priorities, time for stillness and inactivity come a long way down the list.

## "You hem me in - behind and before;

## you have laid your hand upon me." Psalm 139:5

I don't think the other driver blocked me in intentionally but the line from the 139th Psalm did come to mind and perhaps God was somehow at work. In the end, therefore, I was grateful to the driver who had forced me to stop. The world didn't come to an end, the parish didn't collapse, and God was able to show me once again the value of being still.

# Looking forward to Paris

This month sees the start of the Olympic Games in Paris. In describing the Christian life as a marathon race, the writer of Hebrews (12:1-2) challenges us to finish well.

#### 'throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles' (1)

As in a normal race, we have to get rid of any burdens that weigh us down (eg possessions, worries, what others think of us) and besetting sins (wrong habits or attitudes). We can cast our burdens on the Lord (Ps 55:22) and be assured of His forgiveness (1 John 1:9).

#### 'run with perseverance the race marked out for us' (1)

The Christian life is like a marathon not a sprint race, which calls for endurance. The course is marked out for us, as we all have a unique race to run, with its opportunities and difficulties. God knows our path and will provide all that we need to complete the race.

#### 'fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith' (2)

The runner keeps their focus on the finishing line and avoids all distractions. Our focus is on Jesus, who has run the race before us ('author'), but is the one who can show us how to finish well ('perfecter').

We are also surrounded by a 'great cloud of witnesses' (1). These are God's people, both past and present, who are cheering us on!

During the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, the British athlete Derek Redmond was running in the 400 metres semi-finals. About 250 metres from the finish his hamstring tore, and he fell to the ground in pain. However, his father ran on to the track to support him in completing the race. Let's not forget that whatever we face, God is there beside to enable us to finish the race!

# Octotots still need help!

About 18 months ago when there was a change in the leadership of Octotots I read an appeal for help in the church handout, and since then I've had a lot of fun on many a Thursday morning! As the team could do with expanding again I thought I'd outline what it entails and how I've found things as a helper.

Firstly, it is not a commitment to helping every week. Some of the team have other activities on some Thursdays. I myself am inconveniently away in our caravan in the weeks around the school summer holidays. Octotots is only held in school term-time and when the Octagon is not being used as, for example, a polling station.

The adults who bring the youngsters (often as many grandparents as parents) are responsible for watching over their charges with our help and, in my view, the Octagon provides a safe and welcoming space for all. The children are, for the most part, in the 1-3 years age group with a few babies and a few pre-schoolers. Numbers do vary, but I have never felt there were too many for good supervision to be possible.

The helpers gather at about 10am to start the essential coffee machine (easy) and to get the toys and activities set out before arrivals from 10.30am. After that, it's a question of playing, if that's your thing, or reading or drawing or, often just listening and chatting, to old and young alike. I think the company we offer is much appreciated by those in charge of little ones, whose days can seem very long – I remember! One of us looks after refreshments, simple but again appreciated. At 11.30am toys get cleared up (everyone helping) before a short music session, with folk leaving and everything tidied up before 12 noon.

So it really isn't too onerous, and all we need is a few more people to come and see us and then be able to slot in on the days when we can see we're going to be short of help. Could this be you? # Saturday coffee mornings recipes

#### Lemon drizzle cake

This is a very adaptable recipe. If you don't like lemon don't put it in just add a couple of tablespoons of marmalade and brush the top with melted marmalade for than sticky finish. You could also use coconut instead and finish with a little jam on top and sprinkled dessicated coconut. I have even put into the basic recipe the end of a jar of mincemeat! I usually double the ingredients and make two at the same time – and freeze the second.

#### **Ingredients**

6oz Self Raising Flour
4 oz Softened Butter
1 Tsp Baking Powder
6oz Caster Sugar
2Large Eggs (Free Range)
6 Tbsp Milk
Finely grated rind of a large unwaxed lemon lcing
Juice of a large lemon
4oz Caster Sugar



#### Method

Preheat oven to 180 °C/gas mark 4. Tip all cake ingredients into large mixing bowl and beat for 2-3 minutes; mixture will drop easily off spoon.

Spoon mixture into tin and smooth with back of spoon. I use an oblong tin which measures 9" x 8", lined with baking parchment. You could also use a round tin.

Bake for 30-40 minutes until golden & firm to the touch.

Melt together icing ingredients and pour over the cake while it is still HOT. Cool in tin & slice.

- a story, usually a long one with a lot of excitement or interest (from which we get "having a years, or having a chat")


