**One of the things** I enjoy most about India is the constant variety of sights, sounds and smells. It often feels like I have become a child again as I look at animals, plants and situations that are eye catching or unusual. I never cease to enjoy the presence of cows in all the traffic. The cow in the picture on the right was on a good little number

patrolling a more up-market side of town and charming the locals. The owner of the shop seemed positively delighted to be able to feed her a big juicy banana.

The streets are crowded and people manage to carry all sorts of things either on their heads or bicycles or their scooters.

It is now illegal not to wear a crash helmet while on a scooter or motorbike, but it is a rule that doesn't seem to apply to passengers and this lady's four children are balanced precariously on the front and rear. Health and safety is beginning to become a feature of life out here but there s still a long way to go. Crash helmets are worn but almost never strapped on so would be pretty useless in an accident!



#### **In Bangalore**

there is an ever-present reminder of its associations with when the British were here. A statue of King Edward VII stands proudly in the main city park and his mother Victoria occupies an equally regal spot at the other side of the park. The churches and some of the old colonial buildings remain but are increasingly being dwarfed by the city skyscrapers of this amazing city.



Thank you once again to all who are praying for this trip and those holding the fort and at home. Please can you pray for the following:

**Please pray**: One of the five churches here at Bethesda ministries has had to be demolished. It had become unsafe. It ministered to a very small poor community, and they are waiting on God for funds to rebuild it – it is the size of a medium sized front room

Please pray for the tens of thousands in Bangalore who still have to collect water every morning and who lack proper sanitation. Please pray for those who have no access to health care and who are entirely reliant on begging in the streets.



**'That was really good - I liked that!'** and 'Thanks, that was good!' were very encouraging comments from two of the children after the first of our new monthly Sunday Club sessions alongside the 11:15 service, the first of which took place in January. What made them even more rewarding to hear was that they came from different ages across the group: one of our oldest members and one of the younger ones.



My husband, Sam and I have been members of St MM for six years and we have three girls ranging from eight to one year old! I have had experience of similar focused work to this project in other churches and I am a trained primary school teacher. This role encompasses varied hours, with some fixed points too each week. In addition to this I also work as a lecturer in Early Years Education and Development.

I am delighted to report that we had nine children join us in the first Sunday Club session and three team members who all enjoyed their time together. Also positive was feedback that the adults who remained in church enjoyed getting some deeper teaching whilst the children were at Sunday Club. When planning the children's work that will occur on Sunday mornings, we have identified 21 children with whom we are in contact through the 11.15 service; it feels like a really exciting time for this project to start!

I have also really enjoyed being at Octotots for the last 4 weeks and it has been a joy getting to know the team and families who come. I am delighted to report that Octotots is thriving and a very happy place for parents/carers to bring their children. We have a range of ages up to school age and lots of grandparents who seem to travel the country to attend (as they are looking after their grandchildren)! I met a grandmother this week who travels 5.5 hours weekly from Newcastle and comes to Octotots on Thursdays with her grandchildren!

For your information, we have eight aims for the project during the year, two of which are covered above:

## Aim 1 of 8

Start a Sunday club (/Sunday School) ministry through an All Age service on a monthly basis.

## Aim 5 of 8

Develop the ministry of Octotots and start linking the group into an all age service.





## Memories of my time in Malawi

## African Vision Malawi is


celebrating 20 years this April. Such a lot has been achieved during that time: schools and pre-schools renovated and built; a new maternity unit; a training village where people learn new skills; installing



boreholes; supporting students through senior school and university and so much more.

I travelled to Malawi many times over fifteen years and have so many memories of doing things I never dreamt I would do (often way outside my comfort zone). In a country like Malawi, 20 years ago there were no builders' merchants down the road when you needed huge quantities of cement. I had to search to find a company that would sell it to me and then find a lorry driver who would be prepared to drive me and the cement to deliver it to various villages. I didn't know that I would drive trucks full of building materials out to schools so that toilets could be built for the students, or that I would go round schools on the back of a motor bike. Being a founder of African Vision Malawi changed my life and I have loved every minute of it.

One of the things I loved doing the most was visiting schools in the area we support. We now have 20 schools in Malawi linked to schools in the UK and each year we set a theme; schools here and in Malawi exchange work on that theme - last year it was food and growth.



**Sarah,** who spent three years working for us in Malawi as Country Manager, went back with a friend, Philippa in October. Philippa had never been to Malawi before and the two of them visited all the schools, taking with them the work prepared by children from schools here along with gifts of pens, pencils, exercise books as well as some much needed resources for the teachers. They also took a couple of dressing up items (fruit costumes) which they used at each school. You can see from the photo how much the children enjoyed this.

The staff at every school said how much they valued and appreciated the school partnerships and the support they received. Sarah and Philippa gave their time and paid all their own expenses. In spite of fuel shortages, sometimes terrible storms and coping with daily water and power cuts, they had a wonderful time and managed to visit all the schools, bringing back work prepared by the children in Malawi for the children in the UK. We will be holding a fund-raising coffee morning on 10th May in the Octagon so please come along, so that we can continue this vital work. Thank you so much for all the support you have given us. Zikomo kwambiri.

# Sunflower

**Many of you** may have noticed that in 2024, sunflowers kept appearing in Lillington.

The plan was to grow 10,000 sunflowers and the number planted certainly got on for that. Private gardens, the library, health centre and school as well as our very own churchyard were awash with bright sunny blooms, all thanks to a merry band of volunteers and a group of local environmentalists with big ideas. Local poet Matt Black who heads up C.L.E.A.N (Cubbington and Lillington Environmental Action Now), first came up with the idea to plant 10,000 sunflowers. He wanted to create a project that would bring together all the many small but active volunteer

groups, and get them working on one project.

**With the help** of Leamington Sky Garden (which I head up) and Arty Folks, a plan was devised and the hunt began for donations of compost, pots, seeds and most importantly somewhere to raise all these plants. Generous donations of the above along with 'spreading the word' brought all that was needed together, whilst friendly gardeners collected seeds to grow on in polytunnels and greenhouses around the parish and beyond.

June 1st saw the culmination of all these efforts with the Plant Out Day - this was a windy affair, but loads of volunteers turned out and trays of seedlings were dispatched to their various locations around Lillington and Cubbington. Passers-by were cheered and impressed with the flurry of activity; it is hoped that with the repeat of the project in 2025 even more residents in the area will take part!

**It was lovely** to pause and chat with the volunteers and to feel part of a positive and uplifting project. I'm looking forward to building on this enthusiasm in 2025 and adding in some extra twists to the project, to keep people on the edge of their seats.

**The close** of the year's project was marked with celebrations in music, poetry, comedy and art at Lillington Social Club. There was also the showing of an excellent short film that captured all the action of the day. This can be viewed at learningtonskygarden.uk.

We ended the evening by drawing the raffle and a request to clear away the tables and pews, as everything had to be put back to normal for the Sunday morning service. As usual our two main charities are The Myton Hospices and the Motor Neurone Disease Association, both causes having personal family connections. We were delighted with the attendance and the generosity of those there in buying raffle tickets – but also to those who were unable to come and still donated to these worthy causes. This year we were able to donate £455 to MNDA and £405 to Myton, and in addition we made a £240 donation to the church – so if you are any good at maths that was a grand total of £1100 raised. Thank you all so much!!

We did make an announcement that this could be our last year doing the quiz as we are finding all the furniture shifting and to-ing and fro-ing with food etc to be quite exhausting (we spent most of Sunday in a darkened room only coming out for drinks and to reload the dishwasher for the umpteenth time from all the soup/pudding bowls and cutlery!) However, the feedback from our lovely supporters is that they want it to continue, even if we have to change things a bit to make it more manageable. Well, we hate to disappoint and we would love to add to the money we have already raised, which is around £8000 since 2013, so watch this space for news of the 2026 Quiz!
