

congregations to come together as one family to give thanks to God for His bountiful provision. There is something uplifting and strangely enriching in the act of saying thank you. The earth produces so much and a visit to the supermarket reveals just how much variety is on offer and what choice we have as consumers in one of the world's most advanced economies.

people and will be taking a special collection in support of Water Aid which seeks to ensure that people around the world have access to this most basic of essentials.

Most of us have more than enough to eat and do not feel anxious that the water we drink will poison us. Do please join us on October the 13th for our special service to give thanks for what we have and to share with those who still lack these basic provisions.

Please take the time to consider whether this is something you could take on. It only takes a few hours each month, and you may learn something new.



The lane reached the Stratford Canal at the lock cottage which formerly belonged to Doug Smith, the British Waterways cartographer who invented the Lockmaster series of maps.

After a coffee break, we turned North up the towpath of the Stratford Canal, past the Kingswood Basin, until we reached the Old Warwick Road. We spent a short time exploring the canal beyong this road, but as it had by then come on to rain quite

- a story, usually a long one with a lot of excitement or interest (from which we get "having a years, or having a chat")



Saturday coffee mornings recipes



Gluten Free Sticky Toffee Pudding

This fabulous cake was adapted from a mygfguide.com recipe by Sara Snatt.

For the Cake

- 100g chopped dates
- 100g butter
- 150g brown sugar
- 3 eggs
- 50ml treacle
- 200g gluten free self-raising flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 0.5 tsp xanthan gum

- 0.5 tsp ground ginger
- pinch of salt
- 150ml milk

For the toffee sauce:

- 75g salted butter
- 100g brown sugar
- 50ml golden syrup
- 125ml double cream
- 1. Preheat the oven to 160C (fan). Grease the inside of a bake-proof oven dish with butter (approx 20cm x 30cm).
- 2. **Sponge:** Cream the butter and brown sugar together in a bowl until smooth. Add the eggs, one at a time, incorporating well, then add the treacle and mix until well combined. Sift the dry ingredients (flour, baking powder, ginger, salt and xanthan gum) into the bowl and fold them into the wet ingredients. Toss the dates in a little flour then add to the mixture and stir.
- 3. Finally add the milk and mix until smooth. You will have quite a runny batter, but this is perfect. Pour the batter into the baking dish and bake on the middle shelf of the oven for 35-40 minutes at 160C (fan), or until the sponge is fully cooked through.
- 4. **Sauce:** Melt the butter, sugar and golden syrup together in a small nonstick pan over a low heat. Cook very gently for 10 minutes or until it is starting to bubble and simmer slightly. Swirl the pan to mix the ingredients. Add the cream, swirling to ensure fully mixed and then turn off the heat. Set aside until you are ready to serve. Serve sticky toffee sauce in a jug on the side. Enjoy!



ECO TIP!

You worked hard to pick that pumpkin (or buy it from the supermarket...), don't let any of it go to waste. Try roasting the seeds or drying them ready for next year. Then add the rest to your compost by cutting up pumpkins into small pieces, and putting them directly into your compost bin. Make sure to break up the pumpkin to help it break down quicker and spread it around the compost pile.

You can also recycle the tough outer skin to make a temporary bird feeder for your garden. Simply cut the skin in half, pierce a hole in the top, gently loop wire through and use this to hang your

pumpkin from a tree branch. Once hung, hold the pumpkin gently fill the pit with your favourite bird feed.






